



Lesson Plan KS3

Lesson Objective: To explore the features of the landscape of Stony Stratford and its surroundings.

Starter	Main Teaching	Resources
Stony Stratford and its neighbouring areas have a wealth of natural and human geographical features. Using Google Earth and other online maps explore as a class the main Features. A day trip to Stony Stratford to look at some of these features may be possible - we welcome the use of the Parish Hall, adjoining the church, as a study base.	<u>Activity 1 - Natural or man-made?</u> Categorise features on the images and maps The River Great Ouse, the old Mill Race, the main grid road (V4), the A5 dual carriage, balancing lakes, railway, the embankment at Wolverton etc. <u>Activity 2 - Analyse</u> Why is Stony Stratford here? What geographical features would have cause people to stay here in times past? Now? <u>Activity 3 - Compare</u> Compare this landscape and its features with other areas of study nationally and Internationally. <u>Activity 4 - Present</u> Present these findings in various ways - through maps, charts, graphs, tables and photographs.
